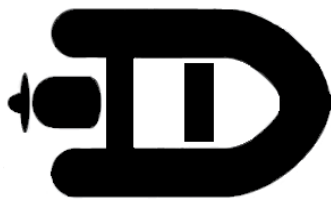


On June 20, 2014, a low pressure system began moving through Central Texas creating localized flooding and potential flash flooding. In preparation for the projected flooding, TDEM activated TX-TF1. As a result, 2 Water Rescue Squads and appropriate personnel and equipment were sent to the area of Brackettville, Texas, on June 20, at 1:30 p.m.

The surrounding areas received nearly 7 inches of rain in only a matter of hours, resulting in flooding of surrounding areas. Additionally, many creeks quickly filled, as well as a number of streets and the major thoroughfare U.S. Highway 277 North.

Though no rescues were made by TX-TF1, the Water Rescue Squads were available in the event their assistance was requested by local responders.

The Water Rescue Squads remained deployed until June 21 when they were demobilized at 5:00 p.m.
