On August 24, 2020. the Texas Department of Emergency Management activated Texas A&M Task Force 1 and Texas Task Force 2 in preparation of 2 Tropical Cyclones affecting Texas Region 2: Tropical Cyclone's Marco and Laura. On August 25, 2020, the following resources were activated in Region 2: one Type 1 Search and Rescue Team, one Type 3 Search and Rescue Team, two Water Group Supervisors, two Support Specialists, 14 Water Rescue Squads, two High Profile Vehicle Squads, one Air Operations, one Liaison for DC-15, and an Overhead Team. These teams performed reconnaissance missions of the local areas, and performed tactical reviews in preparation for (Hurricane/Tropical Cyclone?) Marco.

From August 26-29, 2020, the teams performed numerous tasks assisting the local jurisdiction, including evacuation of a nursing home in Newton, TX(unclear?), windshield surveys of Orange County, TX, and assisted TDEM with COVID Testing Stations and equipment. In the afternoon on August 29, TX-TF 2 co-located with TX-TF 1 at the Ford center to prepare for any further requests.

On August 30, 2020, after no requests for service, all resources were demobilized back to their home stations.
