Type – RAIN

On July 24, 2020, in preparation for Hurricane Hannah's landfall on the Texas Coast, the Texas Department of Emergency Management activated Texas A&M Task Force One. The resources included two Water Group Supervisors, two Support Specialists, six Water Rescue Squads, one Floodwater Boat Team, two High Profile Vehicles, and a Type 1 Search and Rescue Water Capable Team.

On July 25, 2020, Hurricane Hanna made landfall just south of Corpus Christi, as a Category 1 Hurricane. Water Rescue Squads evacuated and rescued many residents of McAllen, TX. Teams also assisted the local jurisdictions with damage assessments, and some squads from the Type 1 Team assisted in the construction of a Medical Alternative Care Site at the McAllen, TX Convention Center.

By July 31, 2020, all resources were released back to their home stations. This deployment consisted of Task Force personnel from 38 different agencies. The teams coordinated 3 rescues, 160 evacuations, along with multiple damage assessments.
