Type - RAIN



On the morning of January 21, 2024, at the request of the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM), Texas A&M Task Force 1 (TX-TF1) activated 2 Type 3 Swiftwater Boat Squads and 1 Water Group Supervisor package in preparation for potential severe weather. 8 more Swiftwater Squads were expected to activate the following day based on the forecast.

By January 23, 2024 the total Task Force resources included 10 Type 3 Swiftwater Boat Squads, 2 High Profile Vehicles, and 5 Helicopter Search and Rescue Technician (HSART) Swimmers with 1 HSART Manager. With heavy rain continuing to pour across the state of Texas, the Task Force anticipated adding 2 Water Mission Ready Packages from Texas A&M Task Force 2 (TX-TF2), and 1 Type 3 Floodwater Boat Squad from Texas A&M Task Force 3 (TX-TF3) the next day.

From January 25-26, 2024, the water squads responded to multiple calls for action; their efforts included several rescues and evacuations including Adults, Kids, Dogs, 1 Shetland Pony, and 1 Goat. By January 28, 2024, many resources were demobilized leaving 6 Water Squads and the 2 TX-TF2 Water Mission Ready Packages. The water Squad from Denton completed further rescues, including 2 Adults and 1 Child.

Over the next few days, resources were slowly released as the water and flooding threats receded. On January 31, 2024, with clear skies and no further request for assistance, all remaining resources were demobilized.
