

This flyer summarizes 2 weather events that occurred in succession. On September 2, 2024, the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) activated 6 Swiftwater Rescue Squads from Texas A&M Task Force 1 (TX-TF1) in anticipation of severe weather across the state. The squads staged overnight in Abilene and Del Rio, Texas awaiting their first orders.

On September 3, 2024, requests for service started early in the morning and continued into the afternoon. The Water Squads investigated multiple calls and evacuated multiple locals in stranded vehicles. Late in the afternoon a few squads were strategically relocated. On September 4-8, 2024, the squads continued monitoring the weather, assisting locals, and maintained contact with the local officials. On September 8, 2024, the first weather event officially ended.

On September 9, 2024, with the second event starting, TDEM activated 5 TX-TF1 Helicopter Search & Rescue Technicians (HSART) along with a Floodwater Rescue Squad from Texas A&M Task Force 3 (TX-TF3).

On September 12, 2024, with the weather threat leaving the state, TX-TF1 and TX-TF3 received authorization to demobilize all remaining resources.
