On June 24, 2025, the State Operations Center (SOC) activated Texas A&M Task Force 1 (TX-TF1) in anticipation of heavy rainfall and possible flooding in Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) Region 4. Two Type 3 Swiftwater Rescue Squads staged in Liberty, Texas overnight.

From June 25-27, 2025, the squads remained in Liberty and performed reconnaissance in boats along the Trinity River to reach areas inaccessible by vehicle. Over these days they made contact with residents along the river and monitored water levels.

On June 28, 2025, the water squads were requested by the Hardin Fire Chief for assistance with a horse that had fallen into an old septic tank in the Moss Bluff area. The crews located the horse and were able to successfully rescue him from the tank and get him to dry ground.

From June 28-29, 2025, the squads monitored the weather and remained ready for any requests for service. On July 1, 2025, with clear skies and the threat of flooding subsided, all resources were released. The squads returned to their home stations for boat and equipment rehabilitation.
