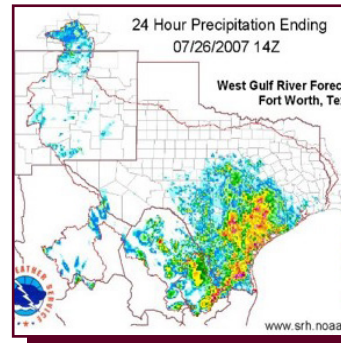
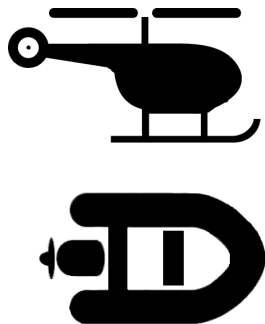


On July 25, 2007, the National Weather Service (NWS) issued a warning regarding significant showers over much of the state for the following 3 days. With significant river flooding already occurring south of I-10, stretching from San Antonio to Houston, flood advisories were issued for a number of counties across Texas. The NWS also predicted major flooding on the Guadalupe River and the Nueces River, moderate to major flooding on the Nueces River, and moderate flooding on the San Antonio River, the Guadalupe River, the Frio River, and the Trinity River.

As a result of the NWS predictions, GDEM activated 8 Water Rescue Squads, 6 HSARTS supporting 3 HH-60s, 1 ESF-9 Coordinator, and 1 ESF-9 Liaison Officer from TX-TF1. As part of their response, TX-TF1 forward deployed 2 Water Rescue Squads to the San Antonio/Bexar County region, with 6 additional Water Rescue Squads pre-staged in College Station awaiting forward deployment by GDEM.

The ESF-9 Coordinator was assigned to the SOC, while the Task Force Liaison Officer was assigned to the San Antonio EOC to coordinate requests for assistance.

On July 28, flooding subsided allowing all resources to be demobilized.
