Texas A&M Task Force 1 deployed Water Rescue resources on Monday, Oct. 8, after heavy rain Sunday night in West and Central Texas resulted in catastrophic flooding along the Llano River, near Junction. The Llano River rose from 2 feet in depth to over 20 feet in one hour. The historic flash flood struck an RV Park along the South Llano River, and at least 4 people were missing. At the request of the Texas Division of Emergency Management, 5 Water Rescue Squads, 3 Helicopter Search & Rescue Technicians (HSART) and 1 Division/Group Supervisor deployed on Oct. 8. TX-TF1 and TX-TF2 each deployed a Search Mission Ready Package to Central Texas on Oct. 10, along with 1 Search Liaison Officer.

TX-TF1 members assisted local responders and other state resources in the search for 4 missing persons along the Llano River.

TX-TF1 and TX-TF2 were demobilized by TDEM on Oct. 14, and teams returned to their home stations.
