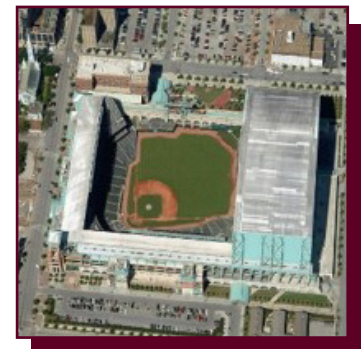
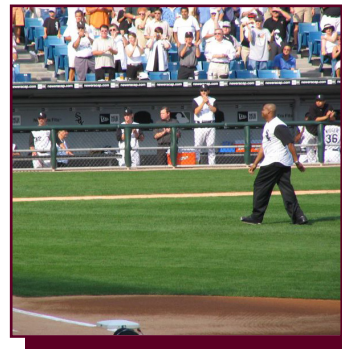
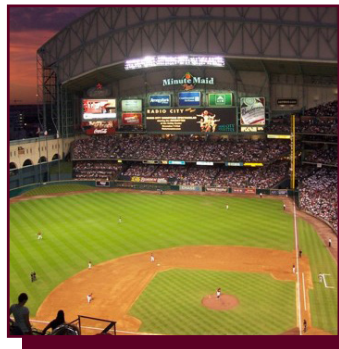

On October 19, 2005, the Houston Astros won the National League Championship Series, securing a bid in the 2005 World Series against the Chicago White Socks. In preparations for the World Series games at Minute Maid Park, in Houston, GDEM placed a TX-TF1 Type-I US&R team on standby for a possible deployment.

Game 1 and 2 of the World Series were played in Chicago, with games 3 and 4 played at Minute Maid Park in Houston on October 25 and 26. Due to the international focus of such a large sporting event, TX-TF1 equipment and command personnel were forward deployed near Houston. The task force was demobilized after Game 4 was over with the White Sox beating the Houston Astros 4-0. Though the loss was heartbreaking, no requests for assistance were made and the team and equipment safely returned to College Station, Texas, the following day.
