## NEUCES FLOODING

### Deployment Statistics

Lasted a total of 3 days

• 2 Water Rescue Squads

Type - **RAIN**



On the morning of October 13, 2013, a complex of rainstorms began developing along the Atascosa and Nueces River in South Texas, from Three Rivers downstream to Lake Corpus Christi. The Nueces River crested at approximately 23 feet in Cotulla, Texas, approximately 8 feet above the flood stage. This was the fourth highest crest on record for the Nueces River. This created a dangerous life and property threat for all those along the river system.

On the early afternoon of October 18, TDEM activated 2 Water Rescue Squads from TX-TF1. As a result, TX-TF1 mobilized the Water Rescue Squads from the nearest participating agencies that already had TX-TF1 boats pre-staged in their stations.

The 2 Water Rescue Squads remained deployed for 3 days assisting the jurisdiction of Live Oak County and conducting recon of low laying areas at the request of the locals, until both squads were demobilized on October 20.
